Seeking your views on our Town Plan

Last month saw the launch of the Bridport and West Bay Town Plan, at a public meeting at the Town Hall on May 3rd.

Observations and input are welcomed from residents, surrounding parishes, local organisations and other authorities. Copies of the plan can be viewed at the Library and at the town council's Mountfield office.

Presenting the Town Plan, Councillor Tony Fifield, chair of the team that prepared the document, stressed that the intention was that it should be firmly rooted in practical and achievable objectives, in areas where the town council has direct control or substantial influence. The Town Plan covers a three year rolling period, to be updated annually, and is expected to become the main input to each year's budget debate.

The first year's activity will set up two new working groups, one to review open spaces and recreation facilities and the other to look at the town council's inclusion policy.

Bridport Town Council is preparing to submit a new bid to upgrade and refurbish the Town Hall.

Members of the public will have an opportunity to look at the new plans and make observations on them. The building is being used increasingly for various meetings and exhibitions.

We would like to be able to have more than the present 100 people in the building, but we desperately need proper access for disabled people.

What is **BLAP**?

BLAP stands for the Bridport Local Area Partnership, established in 2004 to act as the authentic community voice for Bridport and surrounding parishes.

Membership of BLAP is free and open to groups, organisations and individuals in the Bridport area. The BLAP steering group, which meets quarterly, includes representatives from Bridport Council and seven Town neighbouring parishes, and from several other leading local organisations, including the Bridport and District Tourism Association, the Bridport Older People's Forum, the Western Area Transport Action Group (WATAG) and the Bridport Environment Group.

Matters currently being considered by the steering group include the need to establish a community-based forum on health issues, securing affordable housing for local people,



issues relating to the World Heritage Coast and planning matters.

Bridport's historic Town Hall

Are you looking for a meeting venue in the town centre?

The Town Hall is a wonderful venue for small gatherings, club meetings, business meetings, seminars, AGMs etc.

There is a small committee room that comfortably sits about 10-12, while the main hall can accommodate up to 100.

Facilities include a good sized kitchen and toilets. A loop system and microphones can be supplied for larger meetings.

The Hall is available throughout the year except when needed for Council meetings or exhibitions.

The cost of the main hall for a morning, afternoon or evening session is ± 17 , and for a whole day, ± 34 .

The cost for the committee room is $\pounds 6.50$ per session, or $\pounds 11.50$ all day.

Access from East Street can present problems for the disabled but a Stannah chairlift is available.

Council Offices — Mountfield

Are you looking for a meeting venue near the town centre? The Town Council offices at Mountfield include the marriage room, which doubles as a meeting room.

Laid out as a committee room it is suitable for approximately 15-20 people and with the tables removed it could seat between 30-35 people. Facilities include toilets and a loop system. There is level approach, a wide entrance door and double doors into the marriage room, so disabled access is smooth. The marriage/meeting room is available throughout the year except when needed for Council meetings.

The cost of the marriage/meeting room for a morning, afternoon or evening session is $\pounds 17$, and for a whole day, $\pounds 34$.
