
## Save Energy Cut Fuel Bills

## Did you know?



Homes in the UK are too often poorly insulated and don't retain heat well. Wasted energy leaks through walls, windows, roofs and doors, you end up paying for energy you didn't use. 25% of Bridport's homes fall in the lowest two energy rating levels – If your house or flat is uninsulated and draughty, and if your appliances are inefficient, then you're wasting energy and money – and making yourself less snug and warm

Bridport Town Council working with Sustainable Bridport, the Centre for Sustainable Energy and Bridport Community Shed are keen to support households to address the energy price crisis and in doing so help move our community toward a fair transition to a net zero carbon future.

We have recently started a network of volunteer Energy Champions who can drive sustainable energy initiatives for the Bridport Area. Our Energy Champions will be out and about in 2022/23 engaging people, communities and local businesses with saving energy, generating local renewables and tackling fuel poverty.
