The County of Dorset (Various Roads in the District of West Dorset) (Consolidation of Orders Made for the Regulation of Traffic) Order 2014 (Amendment Order No. , 201') East Street, Bridport and Marsh Barn Road (known locally as), West Bay – Restriction of Waiting and Clearway Order

Dorset County Council proposes to make an Order under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) to (3) and 124(1)(d) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ('the Act of 1984') and the Traffic Management Act 2004 and of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1996 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with statutory requirement and in compliance with the 1996 Regulations.

The effect of the Order will be to:

- 1. Introduce a short length of no loading and unloading restriction between 10.30am and 4.30pm on East Street, Bridport near its junction with South Street.
- 2. Revoke the existing 'no waiting at any time' restriction on Marsh Barn Road (known locally as), West Bay and introduce a clearway.
