



PUBLIC NOTICE

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF PUBLIC FOOTPATH 1, BRIDPORT

DORSET COUNTY COUNCIL has made an Order under Section 14 [1] of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984, as amended. All pedestrians will be prohibited from proceeding along footpath 1, from grid reference SY 463 932 (point A on the map below) to grid reference SY 463 930 (Point B on the map below) a distance of approximately 385 metres. The order is needed in order to comply with Health and Safety Regulations, which require the provision of safe working areas and to minimise the likelihood of danger to Highway Users. It will come into operation on the 4 February 2019 for a period of 26 weeks. But it will remain in force for 6 months and can be, extended, with the approval of the Secretary of State for Transport, if necessary.

The Order is required to allow the Environment Agency to carry out essential works on the flood defence wall.

Alternative route; Please follow the pavement south from point A until you reach the roundabout. From here head east, again along the pavement, until you reach point B on the map.
