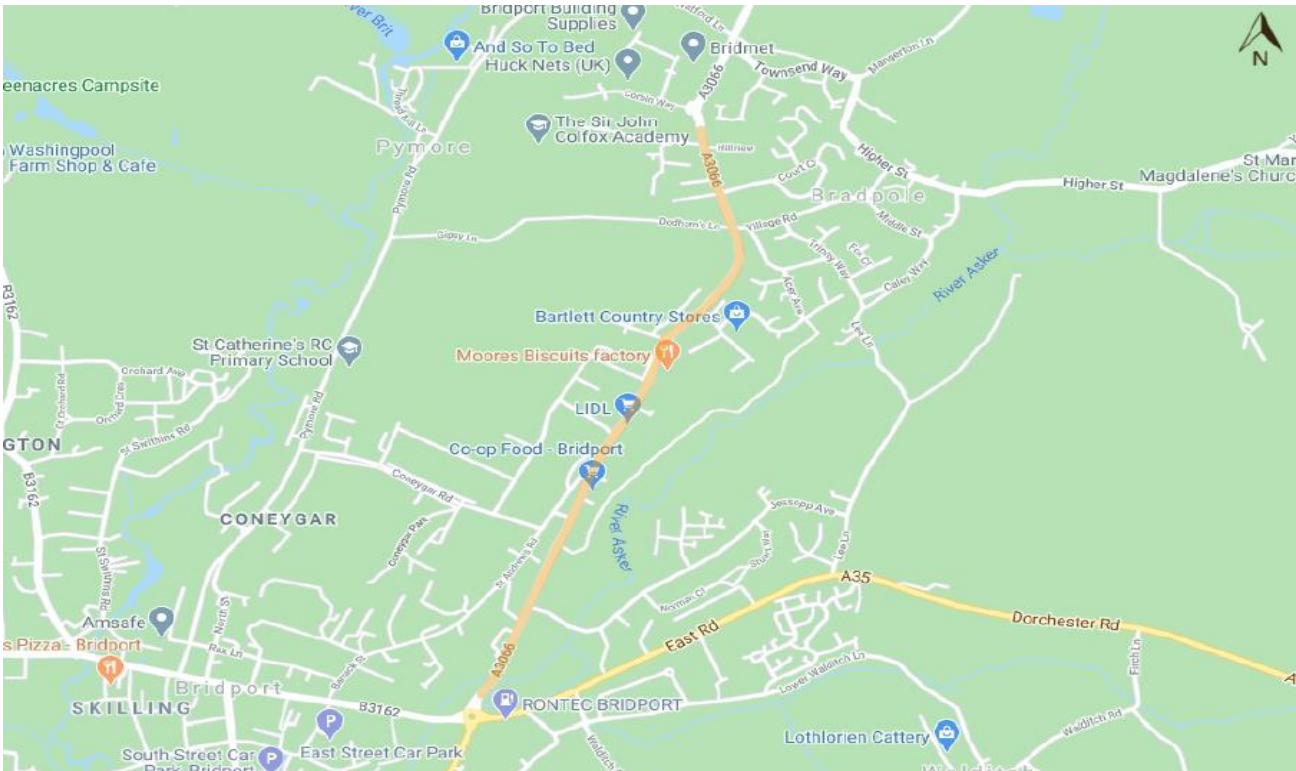

**Micro Asphalt Surface Treatment - A3066 St Andrews Road and Sea Road North, Bridport  
25<sup>th</sup> August 2020 to 4<sup>th</sup> September 2020**

Following the Government's guidance for construction activity– that it should continue where it fits with both the current Public Health England requirements and in accordance with industry safety guidance – Dorset Council is restarting a programme of carefully selected maintenance works.

We hope to start work on **25<sup>th</sup> August 2020** and finish on/by **4<sup>th</sup> September 2020**. We will be working **9am to 4pm** and we will be asking residents to move cars off the road before 9am during this time.

**To carry out the work, roads being treated will have to be controlled using convoy working with stop/go boards and a convoy escort vehicle in operation.** The works will be completed by Colas Ltd on behalf of Dorset Council. Should you have any queries, **please call Colas directly on 01476 404200**. To enable us to safely carry out this work the restrictions will be in place between **9am and 4pm** each day. **The road will be unrestricted overnight and at the weekend.**



<p><b>Q. Can I get to my property?</b></p> <p>We always try to maintain access to properties, but the very nature of the work means that it will cause some inconvenience.</p> <p>At times, we may have to control access to your property or business, which may include asking you to wait for a period of time while we complete a task.</p> <p>Our site traffic operatives and surfacing crews will always assist you as far as possible.</p> <p><b>Q. I have an appointment on one of the closure days, will I be allowed access?</b></p> <p>If you have an appointment, please ask for the Chargehand on site who will be able to arrange for access/egress. Please allow extra travelling time for the appointment.</p> <p><b>Driving through the works area</b></p> <p>It is important that you comply with the site speed limit, usually 10mph, and take extra care.</p> <p>When driving on a temporary road surface you must watch out for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Workforce and machinery in the road</li> <li>• Raised ironworks, such as manhole covers and frames</li> <li>• Ramps where surfacing layers have been laid</li> <li>• Stockpiles of materials</li> </ul> <p><b>Adverse weather conditions</b></p> <p>The works are weather dependent, and the scheme may be delayed or cancelled if there are poor weather conditions.</p>	<p><b>Q. Have the bus companies and emergency services been told?</b></p> <p>The emergency services and bus companies are notified about the works so they are able to make alternative arrangements if necessary. However, emergency access will always be maintained.</p> <p><b>Q. During the works will I be able to park on the road?</b></p> <p>During the daytime works there will be no on-street parking available. However, when the road is open you will still be able to park outside your property.</p> <p><b>Q. What is the work?</b></p> <p>Micro asphalt is a thin surfacing over laid onto the existing surface to seal the surface and restore some texture and skid resistance properties as part of maintaining the highway.</p> <p>Following the application and a few days later any manhole covers or drains covered by the process will be adjusted to the new levels and lining repainted</p> <p>Unfortunately, the work we carry out can be unavoidably noisy but we endeavour to keep the noise to a minimum.</p>
